Kaisa Ypya FADING LIGHT

<u>Date</u> Monday 17 April – 30 April <u>Opening</u> Friday 21st 7pm – 9pm

When creating this collection of watercolour paintings, Kaisa Ypya wanted to look into how tumultuous nature can be and how there is beauty in its destructiveness, volatility and its ability to create both life and death. With every storm, every dying leaf or freezing river, nature is showing us how small and insignificant we are and that we are here just for a blink of an eye, as visitors. When choosing her subject matter she was especially drawn to misty landscapes, cold winters and changes that happen in between. The intoxicating instability.

Originally from Finland, she has lived in Ireland for the last 15 years and has a background in Fine Art and Art Facilitation.

Date Monday 1 May – 14 May Opening Friday 5th 7pm – 9pm

The soul of the urban landscape is composed of layered conversational voices embedded within the skeletal city walls. Urban structures tampered by generations of street advertisements, graffiti tags and vegetative invasion represent a dialogue between past and present, human and nature. With a background in landscape architecture, Alicia has always been fascinated by urban spaces and, in particular, how the relationships between art, nature and human contribution influences the public realm. These recycled papers are restored and reassembled into new independent visual entities in their own right. With urban fabric collected from cities such as Berlin, Leipzig and Dublin, the artist is drawing together the visual voices of various vibrant spaces and mimicking the system of weathering and erosion in her own artistic process, consisting of a cycle of layering and stripping.


